I Cannot Remember My Mother

(Rabindranath Tagore)

Q1: What is the poet doing when he remembers his mother?

Ans. The poet is playing with his playthings when he remembers his mother.

Q2:In what way does the poet feel the presence of his mother?

Ans. The poet feels the presence of his mother in almost everything that he does. When he is playing with his playthings, he feels a tune hovering over them. To him, it is the tune of his mother's lullaby. When the smell of shuili flowers floats in the air, he is reminded of his mother going to a temple in the morning. When he looks outside through his bedroom window, he feels the silent gaze of his mother on his face. He feels her presence in blue sky also.

Q3: What does the poet hear when he is at play?

Summary of the poem

The poem "I cannot remember my mother" is written by Rabindranath Tagore. In this poem, the poet says that he cannot recollect anything about his mother. His mother died in his early childhood. At the time of her death, the poet was too young to know anything about her. He does not know even how she looked like. He recollects his mother only when a tune falls over his ears. Sometimes, when he is playing with his toys, he senses a tune hovering over them. It is the tune of his mother's song which she used to hum while rocking his cradle.

Some times in the early autumn morning, the poet can smell the sweet fragrance of shiuli flowers. This fragrance reminds poet of his mother who used to go the temple in the morning.

Whenever the poet sits at the window of his bedroom and looks at the distant blue sky, he recollects his mother. He remembers how his mother used to bend over him and gaze at him silently. At that time, he feels as if his mother is still looking at him above.

Central Idea of the Poem

The poet had lost his mother in his early childhood. He remembers nothing about his mother. At the time of her death, he was too young to know anything about his mother. He had not got worldly, senses then. He does not remember how she looked like. However, he has a faint recollection of her. A few things remind him of his mother.
