The poet says that no men are strange and no countries are foreign. Under all kinds of different dresses, all men have the same kind of body. All men move one the same earth. And after death all men lie under the same earth. Everywhere it is the same sun, air and water that people enjoy. And everywhere they have to starve when there is a long winter of war.

Everywhere men have the same kind of hands. They do the same kind of labour. They have the same kind of eyes that wake and sleep. They have the same kind of strength that can be won by love.

Therefore, the poet says that we shouldn't heed those who tell us to hate others. We should remember that by hating others, it is only ourselves that we rob, deceive and criticize. By taking up arms against others, we only pollute this earth that belongs to all of us. So, the poet asks us to remember that no men are foreign and no countries are strange.

# "Central Idea of the poem"

All men are the same. They have the same kind of body. They breathe in the same way. Thus no men are strange or foreign. We should never hate others. They are all our brothers. By hating others we lose their love. Thus the poet gives the message of love and brotherhood.
